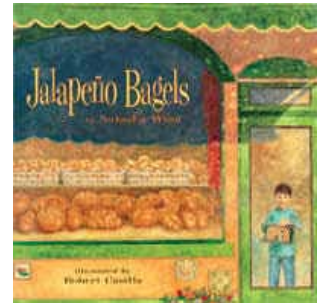

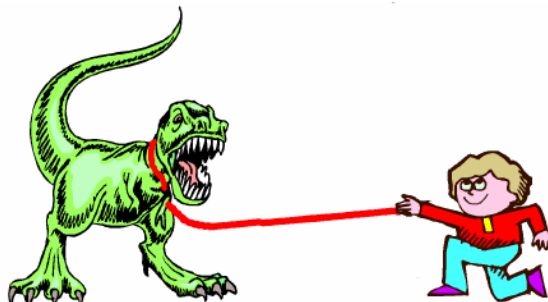

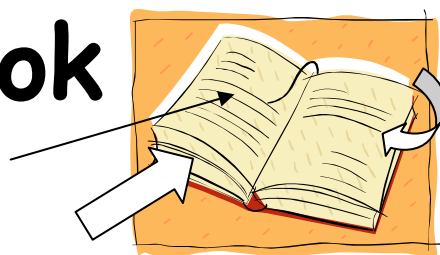

**International**- relating to two or more nations

**knead**- to shape dough by pressing, folding, and stretching it with hands

**flaky**- light; easily separated

**golden**- brown; the color of baked goods after they are cooked

**dessert**- a sweet treat that is eaten after a meal

**batch**- a group of baked goods that are cooked at one time

**Yiddish**- a language spoken by some eastern European Jews and in areas to which eastern European Jews have migrated

**slotted spoon**- a spoon with holes that allows juices to drain out

**salmon**- a type of fish

**pumpernickel**- a type of dark bread

**crinkle**- to form into wrinkles or ripples

**cream**- to blend together

**margarine**- a type of food that is eaten in place of butter

**yeast**- a product that causes baked goods to rise

**overlapping**- placing the edges of two objects so that one is slightly on top of the other

**joint**- the point where two objects are joined

**secure**- not likely to come apart
